What do you get when you drop a pumpkin? SQUASH

Make your own Ranch, Dry Onion Soup Mix and Taco Seasoning and store in small mason jars....This is soooo much HEALTHIER than those you buy at the store!! They contain a TON of stuf that is not good for you!!

Taco Seasoning:
1/2 cup chili powder
1/4 cup onion powder
1/8 cup ground cumin
1 tablespoon garlic powder
1 tablespoon paprika
1 tablespoon sea salt
Put ingredients into a jar and shake.



Dry Onion Soup Mix:
2/3 cup dried, minced onion
3 teaspoons parsley flakes
2 teaspoons onion powder
2 teaspoons turmeric
1 teaspoon celery salt
1 teaspoon sea salt
1 teaspoon sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground pepper Mix all ingredients in a jar, then give the jar a good shake. I'd recommend shaking the jar to mix the ingredients well before each use.

Use 4 tablespoons in a recipe in place of 1 packet of onion soup mix. Store this in a dry, cool place.

Ranch:

5 tablespoons dried minced onions
7 teaspoons parsley flakes
4 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon garlic powder
Mix together and store in an air tight
container.
For dressing: Mix 2 tablespoons dry
mix with 1 cup mayonnaise and 1 cup
buttermilk or sour cream.
For dip: Mix 2 tablespoons dry mix
with 2 cups sour cream or Greek
Yogurt.
Mix up a few hours before serving, so

the flavors all blend.

How to Walk Your Human

Did you know that if you don't walk your human on a regular basis, they become 'chubby'? It is your (very important) job to save them! Insist on at least three walks a day. By presenting your leash to your human, along with

some persistent barking, you will draw their attention to the fact that they need to be walked.







HOW WOULD WE RATE OURSELVES?

How often do we ship packages without considering some of the negative issues, if the package does not reach its intended destination? In our case, a family member had a large box - 21"x19"x11" - 8 pounds - going from Phoenix AZ to Ketchikan, AK. Not heavy but large....

After checking FedEx (\$250+) and UPS (\$200+), they opted for USPS Priority Mail. Two options, \$95 if it was delivered the middle of September or \$128 if it was delivered within a few days. The \$128 delivery was the preferred method, so that was the option selected. Now the saga:

August 28, 2025, 9:39 am - Shipping Label Created

(Package was taken to postal facility at 10:30 a.m. that same morning.)

August 29 - Accepted at USPS Origin Facility, PHOENIX, AZ 85086 7:34 pm

Arrived at USPS Regional Origin Facility, PHOENIX AZ DISTRIBUTION CENTER 8:49 pm

September 10, 2025 - Missing Mail Search Request Initiated 9:43 am

September 17 - Arrived at USPS Destination Facility KENT, WA 98035 3:35 am.

September 19 - Arrived at USPS Regional Destination Facility SEATTLE WA DISTRIBUTION CENTER 4:26 am.

September 19 - Departed USPS Regional Facility SEATTLE WA DISTRIBUTION CENTER 7:29 am

September 21 - Arrived at USPS Regional Destination Facility SEATTLE WA DISTRIBUTION CENTER 4:28 pm

September 24 - In Transit to Next Facility, Arriving Late (Really???)

A call to customer service proved to be totally unsatisfactory, since they don't tell you any more information than what you can read online, in the tracking history.

Their solution.... File a claim for the contents of the package (amount of insurance was \$100) however as a sender, we are still out the cost of the shipping. Since the arrival date is so long after the cheaper (\$95) shipping date (mid-September), a \$33 refund is not even an option.

So the choices are – wait to see if and when the package will ever arrive or file a claim for \$100 and still be out the \$128 shipping fee. The wait is on!

What was learned, as a result of this fiasco – there is a difference between Priority Mail and Priority Express Mail. How many of us thought the difference was "slow boat" and Priority?

Priority Mail is USPS's standard fast service (1-3 business days, non-guaranteed), while Priority Mail Express is its fastest, guaranteed service (1-2 business days, with a money-back guarantee) and offers Sunday/holiday delivery. Priority Mail Express is significantly more expensive but guarantees delivery by a specific date and time, whereas Priority Mail is cheaper but doesn't offer this delivery guarantee. Both services include tracking and insurance for up to \$100. Who knew there were two options - Priority and Priority Express. Hmmm. Wonder what the cost of Priority Express would have been? We are afraid to look. Maybe next time.
