Chamber Chatters & Chuckles

Some of Bayview's town concerns were discussed at the last meeting. The 5th Street Easement, east of the Buttonhook, and issues associated with the Public Boat Launch will continue to be investigated. Any updates, or new information, will be given at future meetings.

Kevin Elmore shared progress, regarding the next Lake Bed cleanup. It is being planned for the spring of 2026. Besides individual volunteers, many agencies will be involved in the actual task. A huge appreciation is going out to the Captain's Wheel, Taverna and Ralph's, who have all agreed to provide lunch for the entire volunteering group.

One of the cleanup crew's ideas is to use a 50-gallon, handle equipped tote, to collect the numerous smaller items. Once it is filled, it can then be hoisted to the surface, to be emptied. This simple convenience will save the divers an untold amount of time, allowing them to clean more areas, since they will not have to constantly swim to the surface to dispose of debris.

The Captain's Wheel is planning to host a Fireworks Fund Auction in the very near future. Currently, a possible date is Saturday, December 5th, 2025, but check with the staff for the actual date and time of the event.

Kevin and Davina Huff and their staff from Ralph's, Marie Streater and the Captain's Wheel staff, along with Chad Cadnum, as the announcer extraordinaire, have produced some impressive results from their previous Fireworks Auctions. Their combined efforts, along with the many generous donations, have given the fireworks fund totals some tremendous and much needed financial boosts.

So far, the total amount collected, for next year's show is sadly lacking. If we can't possibly triple the already collected amount, we will probably have to cancel next year's event. At today's cost of fireworks, \$13,270. would not provide much of a display. This would really be a shame since 2026 will be our country's 250th anniversary. We only have the upcoming months of November and December to correct this shortfall.

Each year the Chamber donates money toward the *Community Center's* upkeep. This year the members have voted to also include *Timberlake Fire District*, for their paramedic training, *Bestowing the Basics* and *Dogsmile Adventures* as recipients of these donated funds.



An interview from the desk of Huckleberry Ace-woof reporter, with Pam Tonhofer Deer-Whisperer

To my delight, I received an email back from Marian later that day to advise me I should see the fawn hopefully reunited with its mother soon. The fawn was free! Marian's an amazing individual; I hope to meet her someday.

A few days later, not even a week, a mother, two yearlings, a larger spotted fawn and a small one with spots were all on the side of my house eating grass. I was so thankful the fawn found its family.

I sleep so much better now. I saw the family today, mom evidently told the yearlings it was time to be on their own so she can concentrate on her little ones."

will serve as the headquarters to coordinate rescue efforts. DO <u>NOT</u> call for mechanical problems or lack of gas. This group is for **LIFE-THREATENING** emergencies only.




