



Our accomplishments were plentiful this past year, with lots of hard work from our board & staff, and donations from people like you.

- The entrance, foyer, hallway, upstairs main hall, and exterior were painted with new colors.
- The interior and exterior upper men's room, and foyer area received extensive repairs.
- The exterior lights were replaced with new ones.

- Security cameras were added to garden/building areas.
- The second Memorial Wall was completed.
- Volunteers worked hard to rescue our Memorial Garden.




